<b>Application Process</b>	Grassroots Organizing for Social Change program begins with an online pre-application. Pre-application deadlines have two cycles and Renewal Reviews are accepted year round and collated bi-monthly. Then after Foundation review, select organizations will be invited to submit a full proposal before the deadline. See website for details.
<b>Eligibility</b>	One-year grants for up to \$25,000 to constituent-led, direct-action organizations working for systems change. Organizations with budgets under \$500,000 are eligible to apply. Only organizations with 501(c)3 status, or who have a fiscal agent with this status are eligible to apply. Areas NOT funded include: direct services to individuals, international programs, discretionary or emergency requests, schools/programs for schools, colleges or universities, scholarship programs, research, litigation or legal expenses, capital or endowment campaigns, state agencies/government programs, business associations, religious activities, arts or media programs, and advocacy programs. Please review website for details.
<b>Priorities</b>	Grassroots, constituent-led organizing is among the most effective means to create social change. We define organizing as collective action from the bottom up that challenges the status quo, demands changes in policy and practice, educates communities about root causes, and advocates and agitates for systemic and just solutions. Please review website for the priority strategies we require for eligibility.
<b>Deadline</b>	See website for deadlines.
<b>Grant Size</b>	Grants range from \$1,000 to \$25,000

<b>Application Process</b>	Requests for proposals are made in the summer or fall for the local Tompkins County cycle. Applications are available in September and October for the national cycle. Pre-applications for the national grant begin on September 1 <sup>st</sup> with a deadline on November 1 <sup>st</sup> .
<b>Eligibility</b>	Grants are made available to low-income, self-help groups who are working to develop economic and/or social strength and self-determination in their community to bring about institutional change.
<b>Grant Size</b>	Average local grant is around \$1,000. National grants range from \$25,000 to \$75,000.

<b>Application Process</b>	All contribution requests must be submitted through the online application. Organizations that receive funding are expected to complete an online impact report. New users will have to complete the online eligibility quiz prior to submitting an application. Citizens Bank reviews applications on an ongoing basis. It may take up to three months for a request to be fully vetted. Please note that a site visit and additional information may be required prior to a final determination. Organizations will be notified of approval/denial of submitted applications in writing.
<b>Eligibility</b>	Citizens does not support: annual appeals/operating support, individuals, single disease/issue information and research organizations, religious organizations, labor, fraternal and veterans organizations, political organizations/projects, operating deficits, governmental organizations, endowment, trips and tours, payments on bank loans, private foundations or trusts, historic preservation, public or private education institutions.
<b>Priorities</b>	Citizen's primarily supports programs who fight hunger/food insecurity, provide shelter and housing, teach money management, and strengthen communities through economic and neighborhood development.

<b>Application Process</b>	<p><b>WBC Unexpected Needs Grants up to \$1,000</b> - A <a href="#">rolling-application</a> grants opportunity to help not-for-profits fund unexpected needs or emergencies. Awards will be made following the next available Board Meeting.</p> <p><b>WBC Grants up to \$5,000 for calendar year 2019</b> - <a href="#">Applications</a> are due by September 20, 2019 for grants up to \$5,000. Projects must be completed by December 31, 2020.</p> <p><b>WBC Innovation Grant up to \$10,000 for calendar year 2020</b> - Applications accepted in March 2020 for a “Big Idea” project that will have a significant impact on women and girls in our community. Special consideration will be given to new projects for which funding has previously not been available, and for existing projects for which additional funding will have a major impact. <b>Eligibility</b>	The City Federation of Women’s Organizations welcomes grant applications from nonprofit organizations that are tax-exempt under section 501(c)3. Organizations and individuals without the 501(c)3 designations will be required to be sponsored by a nonprofit organization that does have a 501(c)3. Projects must improve the quality of life for Tompkins County women and girls in one or more of the following: community development, education, health, human services, gender equity, or administrative costs. Areas not considered for funding include: debt reduction, religious organizations/projects, political parties/campaigns, annual appeals and membership contributions, religious organizations/projects for religious purposes, and endowment campaigns.
<b>Priorities</b>	Grants should address needs and opportunities that will improve the quality of life for all women and girls in Tompkins County.
<b>Deadline</b>	Applications for WBC \$5000 grants are due in September; Applications for WBC Innovation Grants are due in March; WBC Unexpected Needs Grant applications can be submitted anytime.
<b>Grant Size</b>	Unexpected needs grants are up to \$1000; WBC grants are up to \$5,000; WBC Legacy Grants are up to \$10,000.

<b>Grant Opportunity</b>	<b>Specific Opportunity Stipend of Tompkins County (SOS of Tompkins)</b>
<b>Application Process</b>	Guidelines and application available on website.
<b>Eligibility</b>	Specific Opportunity Stipend Tompkins is designed to support Tompkins County artists (of all disciplines) with a consistent record of producing art. The grants will also support artists at the beginning of an artistic career. The grant can be used for projects or opportunities that have an impact on, or give a step up to, the artist's professional career. Artists can apply for costs associated with travel costs, performance expenses, exhibition costs, and other such expenses.
<b>Priorities</b>	Local artists and their audiences, professional development in the arts.
<b>Deadline</b>	Spring and fall, based on the time of opportunities. Check website for details.
<b>Grant Size</b>	Maximum Grant is \$1,500

<b>Grant Opportunity</b>	<b>Grants for Arts Programs (GAP)</b>
<b>Eligibility</b>	Funds are awarded to not for profits throughout the County such as libraries, arts organizations, towns, villages, community centers and the like for professional arts and cultural projects. (Individual artists can apply to "GAP" by finding a not-for-profit organization to sponsor their event.)
<b>Priorities</b>	Funded projects must be arts and cultural in nature, open to and promoted to the general public of Tompkins County.
<b>Deadline</b>	Fall of the year prior to initiation of projects. Check website for details.
<b>Grant Size</b>	Ranges from \$500-\$2,500. Average grant size is around \$1,200.

<b>Grant Opportunity</b>	<b>The Artist in Community Grant</b>
<b>Eligibility</b>	Funds support the creation of new work of Tompkins County artists whose interaction with communities is an integral part of their art-making. Applicant artists must be residents of Tompkins County, must be 18 years of age at the time of application, and must not be enrolled in a degree program.
<b>Priorities</b>	Local artists and their audiences.
<b>Deadline</b>	October, check website for details.
<b>Grant Size</b>	Two grants of \$2,500 are available.
<b>Grant Opportunity</b>	<b>Arts Education Grant</b>
<b>Eligibility</b>	Funds are designed to assist not-for-profit organizations, cultural groups and/or individual artists in providing arts education projects to students up to 18 years of age.
<b>Priorities</b>	Professional and educational development for public school aged students in the arts.
<b>Deadline</b>	November, check website for details.
<b>Grant Size</b>	Ranges from \$1,000 - \$2,500; most around \$2,000.

<b>Eligibility</b>	Grant recipients must be tax-exempt organizations. Applications must serve residents of Tompkins County, with the exception of the Library Grant Cycle which serves all 33 libraries in the Finger Lakes Library System (Cayuga, Cortland, Seneca, Tioga and Tompkins Counties).
<b>Priorities</b>	Arts & culture, community building, education, libraries, environment, health & human services, women, aging, youth, animal welfare. The Community Foundation encourages strategic collaboration between organizations and across sectors.

<b>Eligibility</b>	The Foundation does not offer funding to individuals, private foundations, organizations that are not tax-exempt under 501(c)3, organizations classified by the IRS as 509(a)3, national or regional organizations, religious organizations/projects, schools, political actions/advocacy, endowment funds, research, international organizations, fraternal groups or athletic teams.
<b>Priorities</b>	Our community action grant priorities include education and neighborhood improvement, economic development, youth development, community problem-solving, assistance to disadvantaged people, environmental conservation and cultural enrichment.
<b>Deadline/Funding Cycle</b>	We consider grant applications twice a year. Please submit your proposal to the contact at the daily newspaper or television station in your area. Applications should be postmarked before the deadlines in February or August, exceptions are listed in the Grant Contact list. Applicants are notified of final decisions 90–120 days after deadlines.
