Using a Housing First approach built on the principles and methods of trauma informed care, St. John's Community Services-NY (SJCS-NY) proposes to support 5 chronically homeless individuals with children, through scattered site PSH+. It is anticipated that five of the housing units will be two – bedroom apartments and five of the units will be three bedroom apartments throughout Ithaca and Tompkins County. While first and foremost the objective is to secure safe and affordable housing, which they will help select, SJCS-NY will employ its extensive history and experience with individualized, clinical, employment, educational, and person-centered services to support these individuals to define and move toward life goals with respect to mental and physical health, relationships, employment, education, parenting skills, chemical abuse, and other life domains. These services will be designed to develop a personal vision of their better tomorrow and support that vision toward greater interdependence, self-sufficiency, personal development, and permanent housing. All of this will be done by meeting each family member where they are at, building on their strengths, addressing their support needs, and moving at the pace "where they are at". This means that SJCS will remain committed to securing and assisting those we serve in maintaining housing as essential and non-negotiable, with no programmatic prerequisites, and regardless of gender conformity, sobriety status, or other restrictive admission policies. Core values that have guided SJCS program development and services are that all people should be able to live fully and completely in a community and environment of their own choosing, and, have access to the services and supports needed to establish and maintain their economic, physical, and social inter-dependence. Grant funds can be used to pay for technology that the individual believes is needed to make the unit safe, including but not limited to doorbell cameras, security systems, phone, and internet service when necessary to support security systems for the unit, etc.
