Tompkins County Emergency Food and Shelter Program Now Accepting Funding Applications

Tompkins County has been awarded federal funds made available through the Department of Homeland Security (DHS)/Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) under the Emergency Food and Shelter National Board Program.

Tompkins County has been chosen to receive \$30,619 to supplement emergency food and shelter programs in the county.

The selection was made by a National Board that is chaired by the U. S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency and consists of representatives from American Red Cross; Catholic Charities, USA; National Council of the Churches of Christ in the USA; The Jewish Federations of North America, The Salvation Army; and, United Way Worldwide. The National Board was charged to distribute funds appropriated by Congress to help expand the capacity of food and shelter programs in high-need areas around the country.

A Local Board made up of representatives from the Tompkins County, City of Ithaca, Human Services Coalition, United Way, service providers, faith community, and others will determine how the funds awarded to Tompkins County are to be distributed among the emergency food and shelter programs run by local service agencies in the area. The Local Board is responsible for recommending agencies to receive these funds and any additional funds made available under this phase of the program.

Under the terms of the grant from the National Board, local agencies chosen to receive funds must: 1) be private voluntary non-profits or units of government, 2) be eligible to receive Federal funds, 3) have an accounting system, 4) practice nondiscrimination, 5) have demonstrated the capability to deliver emergency food and/or shelter programs, and 6) if they are a private voluntary organization, have a voluntary board. Qualifying agencies are urged to apply.

Emergency Food and Shelter funds have previously been distributed in Tompkins County. The Advocacy Center, Catholic Charities, Loaves and Fishes, Family & Children's Service, Groton Community Cupboard, Mutual Aid Tompkins, OAR, St. John's Community Services, the Learning Web, United Way of Tompkins County, and Village at Ithaca have participated most recently. These agencies were responsible for providing meals, pantry food, formula, shelter, rental assistance, and other services for county residents.
