Application Process	The National Grassroots Organizing grant program begins with an Eligibility Questionnaire (found on the website) and, if eligible, will lead to an online Application. As a rolling process, applications can be submitted anytime throughout the year. If invited, the next step will be a conversation with the Employee Committee in consideration of a two-year grant.
Eligibility	Two-year grants for up to \$30,000 per year (average grant size of \$20,000 per year) to constituent-led, direct-action organizations working for systems change. Organizations with budgets under \$350,000 are eligible to apply. Only organizations with 501(c)3 status, or who have a fiscal agent with this status are eligible to apply. Areas NOT funded include: direct services to individuals, international programs, discretionary or emergency requests, schools/programs for schools, colleges or universities, scholarship programs, research, litigation or legal expenses, capital or endowment campaigns, state agencies/government programs, business associations, religious activities, arts or media programs, and advocacy programs. Priorities	Grassroots, constituent-led organizing is among the most effective means to create social change. We define organizing as collective action from the bottom up that challenges the status quo, demands changes in policy and practice, educates communities about root causes, and advocates and agitates for systemic and just solutions. Eligibility	The City Federation of Women's Organizations (CFWO) welcomes grant applications from nonprofit organizations that are tax-exempt under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and from governmental agencies serving Tompkins County. Organizations without a 501(c)(3) designation, will be required to be sponsored by a nonprofit organization that does have a 501(c)(3) designation.
	Projects must improve the quality of life for Tompkins County women and/or girls in one or more of the following: community development and engagement, education, health, human services, gender equity. Funding for administrative/operating costs directly related to a specific project is allowed. Project areas <u>not</u> considered for funding include: debt reduction, projects for religious purposes, political parties/campaigns, annual appeals and membership contributions, and endowment campaigns.

Eligibility	Specific Opportunity Stipend Tompkins is designed to support Tompkins County artists (of all disciplines) with a consistent record of producing art. The grants will also support artists at the beginning of an artistic career. The grant can be used for "Specific Opportunities", projects or opportunities that have an impact on, or give a step up to, the artist's professional career. The SOS Grant can fund the following costs of Specific Opportunities: travel/accommodation costs, rental of equipment or materials, hiring of technical support, promotional expenses, documentation of work, registration or tuition fees, and workshops or mentorships. Artists must have resided in Tompkins County for at least a year and plan to remain in the County for the next five years.

Eligibility	Funds are awarded to not for profits throughout the County such as libraries, arts organizations, towns, villages, community centers and the like for professional arts and cultural projects. Applicant must be a not-for-profit organization, association, or institution located in Tompkins County with a Tompkins mailing address whose primary mission is providing services to residents of Tompkins. Individual artists can apply to "GAP" by finding a not-for-profit organization to sponsor their event. See guidelines on the website for more information, including what GAP cannot fund.
Priorities	Funded projects must be arts and cultural in nature, open to and promoted to the general public of Tompkins County. Preference is given to requests that fill community needs and reach diverse cultures and communities in Tompkins County. Funding preferences include requests that connect with culturally isolated communities, activities of local Arts Organizations, and requests that contribute to the artistic landscape of Tompkins County.

Eligibility	Funds support the creation of new work of Tompkins County artists whose interaction with communities is an integral part of their art-making. Applicant artists must be residents of Tompkins County, must be 18 years of age at the time of application, and must not be enrolled in a degree program. Eligibility	Funds are designed to assist not-for-profit organizations, cultural groups and/or individual artists in providing arts education projects to students up to 18 years of age. Funds support arts education projects in school during the school day and in after-school and community based settings for K-12 youth. Projects must be carried out in partnership with a public school or community based cultural organization. See guidelines on the website for more information.
Priorities	Professional and educational development for public school aged students in the arts. A priority is fulfilling a cultural need or otherwise unmet need in terms of artistic discipline, geography or community engagement, increased access to the arts, and reaching a broad and diverse audience. See guidelines on the website for more funding priorities.

Please reach out if you are unsure if your request fits our guidelines. If you choose to submit an LOI, please do not submit a full proposal unless contacted by a staff member. Most decisions are made within the quarter.
Eligibility	The Foundation does not make grants to individuals, for-profit entities, endowments or for debt reduction. Capital grants are rarely provided and are generally limited to nonprofits in Tompkins County, NY. Eligible organizations must be classified under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and must meet the IRS Public Support Test.
